### September/October

- Consider interacting in-person or virtually with representatives from interesting schools/programs.

### November/December

- Sign up to take the ASVAB, a free career exploration assessment <a href="https://www.asvabprogram.com/">https://www.asvabprogram.com/</a>
- Maintain good grades, and prepare for first semester exams.
- Use an online career discovery tool to explore what matches your interests!

## January/February/March

- Determine a preliminary list of colleges/institutions/training programs that interest you.
- Develop a system for organizing future-planning materials.
- Register to take college admissions tests during second semester both ACT (<u>www.act.org/bts</u>) [one test session FREE during school-day in spring] *and* SAT (<u>www.sat.org/register</u>).
- Schedule your senior classes. Continue monitoring your graduation progress credits, tests, seals <a href="https://docs.google.com/document/d/1470HgamNFmkRQjVf">https://docs.google.com/document/d/1470HgamNFmkRQjVf</a> qR2tPdb4ivyGdDMtto6QcyMgWk/
- If available, attend nearby college fairs (in the past, DHS has taken juniors to NSCC in March).
- Test prep may boost ACT/SAT scores! (https://academy.act.org/) (https://www.khanacademy.org/sat)
- Consider using spring break for college visits. Settle on location and major before senior year?

# April/May

- Your counselor can help process inquiries about graduating or planning your future.
- Look into summer employment/opportunities, and prepare for second semester exams.

#### **Summer**

- Organize your academic, test scores, community service, leadership roles, honors/awards, etc.
- **Wise tip**: narrow down, visit, and *apply for* (if allowed) desired colleges in spring or summer of your *junior* year. If they accept your application, you can start applying for institutional scholarships as a senior in the fall for the best/earliest chance at the most scholarship dollars!
- Complete the NCAA Initial Eligibility form <u>if</u> you hope to play Division I or II collegiate sports (<u>www.eligibilitycenter.org</u>).
